Main objectives of the project proposal (max 1 p):

Examination of painting techniques in the NGI Prodigal Son series, which are medium format works by Murillo, and draw comparisons with technical documentation of large format paintings by Murillo in the collection of the Museo del Prado.

Evaluation of the technical process in the Prodigal Son series by Murillo with special interest in the degradation of the blue pigments and how it affects to the current appearance of the series.

Additionally, to go more in depth on the uses of ground layers and how these differ in his medium and large format paintings.

Summer 2019 Exhibition on Murillo curated by Peter Cherry, which will include the restored Prodigal Son series and a focus on the research undertaken on Murillo's materials and techniques.

The 2019 exhibition will be accompanied by a catalogue and scholarly conference.

The exhibition will have a dedicated section on the NGI website whilst the NGI digital media team will be developing an app for the exhibition also.
